FROM THE CHAIR

ow would you compare a hike in the Cascades to helping lead a hospital foundation board? Apples and oranges? At first glance, it seems so. Dress shoes last me years on the job, but I ruined a pair of hiking boots in one day climbing Mt. St. Helens a few summers ago. And, as far as cuisine, I'll take a lunch cart or bistro any day over the freeze-dried fare you'll find on long backpacking trips.

But in other respects, the two have important things in common. It helps to be patient, alert and in good condition for both ventures. My CPA experience helps me offer sound advice to the not-for-profit hospital foundation, just as regular workouts keep me in shape for hiking. Both require careful planning to avoid pitfalls. Perhaps the most important factor, however, is that success depends on teamwork. I would have starved on my three-week backpack trip from Yosemite to Mt. Whitney without a mountain of support from family and friends. Likewise, my effort on behalf of the Salem Hospital Foundation relies on tremendously dedicated board colleagues, a terrific foundation staff and inspired collaboration with Salem Hospital. But you, the many donors, are the life blood of this organization.

In this report, as in past ones, you'll see the miracle of your contributions in stories like the Therapy Courtyard, the Pediatric Unit remodel, the Trilogy equipment for cancer treatment and the Community Health Education Center. Some donors specify where their hard-earned dollars are to be used, while others leave that up to us. Even small donations are important: witness the program where infant car seats go home with new mothers in need, or scholarships are awarded to students pursuing health-care degrees.

My love of numbers and science is a trait I inherited from my father, a radiation physicist and cancer treatment pioneer. My love of Salem Hospital and this Foundation is partly because I lost my father to cancer, as well as a husband and sister. But I truly believe in contributing back to community organizations, and every day I see how that makes a difference in our lives and our lifestyle.

Your busy life may curtail the amount of hours you can devote to your church, the hospital or your children's school activities. So that's where your ongoing support of even a few dollars a week makes a huge difference.

The Foundation's commitment to community health is, in itself, a monumental trek. The Foundation is healthy, we've got the right gear and we're bearing true to our compass. But to reach that peak, well, that's where you come in.

I CANNOT DO EVERYTHING. BUT I CAN DO SOMETHING.

hose words by Helen Keller could easily sum up Crystal and Doug Buchheit's journey with a project called CAN Cancer.

"It all started a few years ago when I went to a conference on garbage; or as those of us in the business call it, 'refuse and recycling;' and learned about a program started in Bend by a family who had been touched by cancer."

Crystal and her husband Doug are part owners of Suburban Garbage, a local family-owned business since 1976.

The CAN Cancer idea seemed simple enough—give people the opportunity to support cancer patients in the community who need assistance with non-medical expenses such as food, gas, utility bills, etc.

"When talking to Corinne, one of the founders of CAN Cancer, I could see her passion, and I thought to myself, I wonder if this is something we could do in Salem."

But then life happened. Crystal was busy raising a family, helping run a business and caring for an ill mother. But something in the back of her mind kept bringing her back to 'How can I make this happen in my community?"

Corinne suggested Crystal check with her local hospital to see if they could help. So when Crystal found the courage to pick up the phone and was connected to the Salem Hospital Foundation, CAN Cancer was off and running.

"I was so apprehensive that starting this program would take a huge amount of work, because after all, we are a small family business," said Crystal. "But when I talked with the Foundation staff and they said, 'We'd love to help, what can we do?' it was amazing how it all just fell into place."

When Crystal learned the Foundation had a fund that provided financial assistance to cancer patients in need, she said she knew CAN Cancer was meant to happen. Her first step was to educate their employees (haulers). Next she created and printed information pieces, and then distributed donation envelopes. The easy-to-use envelopes were mailed out in October with the recycling calendars to all of Suburban Garbage's approximately 7,000 customers.

"We really didn't have any idea of the type of response we'd receive," said Crystal. "And since the envelopes were being mailed directly to the hospital Foundation, I had to wait and see if this was something our customers would be interested in."

But by the end of December, Crystal had her answer. Just three months into the program, the Salem Hospital Foundation had received close to \$4,000 from CAN Cancer donors.

"My mom passed away recently, and she used to make lap blankets for cancer patients going through chemotherapy," said Crystal. "I'm so proud that CAN Cancer is turning into a way to honor her, and help others as well."

EMPLOYEE SPOTLIGHT

For the past 20 years, Amy has spent thousands of hours, and probably walked thousands of miles around campus, helping educate Salem Hospital employees on a variety of subjects. After all, that's her job. But she also serves on a number of hospital committees, including the Falls committee (yes, it's just what it sounds like—staff working together to reduce patient falls), coordinates the Certified Nursing Assistant program, teaches CPR and oversees the preceptor program, which pairs new nurses with more experienced nurses.

What made you decide to make your first gift to the Foundation?

I felt the need to support the great work I knew the Foundation was doing. They are involved with so many different programs to help our patients, as well as our staff, and I wanted to be a part of that. Also, I was at a point in my life where I didn't have much time to volunteer, but I was able to help with a regular financial commitment.

What type of programs do you support and why?

At first, I asked that my contributions be used where ever there was the greatest need. Then once the Foundation became involved in creating the hospital's Community Health Education Center (CHEC), I redirected my donations there. The CHEC provides such a needed service to our community, and supports hospital staff by giving them resources to provide high quality, evidence-based care to our patients. And, of course I feel strongly that education is always a wonderful thing to support!

What do you hope to accomplish with your gifts?

By giving my gifts to the Foundation, the Foundation can continue to make a difference in our hospital and in our community. I know they will continue to do amazing things like funding the therapy courtyard for the new inpatient rehabilitation unit, supporting education for the community and the staff, and helping meet the needs of cancer patients, the elderly, and children.

Why do you feel it's important for hospital employees to financially support the Foundation?

Supporting the Foundation is a great way for all of us to give back to our community, and to support one another within the hospital family. Being able to contribute through payroll deduction is so easy. And with over 3,500 employees, think about what amazing things could be done if everyone gave even as little as \$5 each pay period.

What message do you have for people considering making a gift to the Foundation?

I trust that my contributions to the Foundation are being used in ways that benefit the community and support the hospital's mission. And I know that all gifts, no matter how big or small, are appreciated and do make a difference.

is mother is a nurse. So, too, is his twin sister in Portland. And his girlfriend, already a nurse in Salem Hospital's Emergency Department, is enrolled in the nurse practitioner program at OHSU. But Thomas Balcom had set his mind on a different medical profession. With a decade of volunteering at a children's orphanage in Mexico and youth camps in Romania and Canada, he decided on a Physician Assistant degree program at Pacific University when he was stopped short in his tracks.

Thomas, a dedicated athlete and student, already had an Anthropology degree from Willamette University. Then, while training as an EMT, he began working at Salem Hospital's Emergency Department. Because of an interest in working with Oregon's underprivileged, he met Todd Gould, a founder of Salem Free Clinics.

"It was a simple conversation, really," Thomas recalled. We can't use Physician Assistants but we can use Nurse Practitioners, Gould told him. Nursing is a better fit for patients in a community clinic setting, Gould continued. Nurses are more independent in some ways and focused on the whole person, not just the medical diagnosis and prescription.

So with that in mind, he reoriented his compass toward a nursing degree at Linfield College, which he'll be finishing this summer. To make this sidestep in career plans, Thomas applied for financial assistance from the Salem Hospital Foundation.

And in 2012, scholarships awarded added up to nearly \$160,000.

"I owe a lot to Salem Hospital already," he said. "They gave me a job in the Emergency Department before I had much EMT experience. And now, giving me time off for school, and also receiving a scholarship from the Foundation-well it inspires me greatly—to excel and to reach higher."

Raised on the Oregon coast, young Thomas saw the world through a prism lit by his faith, family life and community service. "My parents still recall the time when, as a kid, I insisted they stop the car at a busy intersection in Florence so that I could get out and hand my lunch to a homeless person holding a sign asking for help.

"I treasure the idea of balance in my life, because I've seen students and adults burn themselves out for their career," said Thomas. "The Foundation's support is so crucial for that reason."

And while he may have to curtail his days of surfing and running in exchange for a stethoscope, the Foundation scholarship will give him a chance to slow down a bit, and allow his feet to keep pace with his heart's passion to bring health, hope and balance to others.

INPATIENT REHABILITATION THERAPY COURTYARD

ometimes the first step is only a tentative shuffle, with hands planted firmly on a walker and a physical therapist at each elbow. Soon enough, however, patients recovering from conditions such as strokes, brain or spinal cord injuries, begin to gain strength, mobility and confidence. And the new inpatient rehabilitation unit's therapy courtyard is just the place where people can begin to regain their stride after a serious illness or injury.

"We want each patient to practice those things they'll be doing in the first days after leaving the hospital," said Laura Aspinwall, physical therapist and therapy supervisor. "Steps, handrails, concrete ramps, curbs, sidewalks, grass, gravel and uneven surfaces, as well

as sitting at different heights—these items are all part of what makes the therapy courtyard so beneficial."

The Salem Hospital Foundation provided \$543,000 to create the therapy courtyard which is located on the new inpatient rehabilitation unit on the 4th floor of building B on the hospital's main campus.

In fair weather, patients who use the courtyard garden are eager for new steps in their progress, and are greeted by sunlight and fresh air. Gardening will be encouraged, since there are raised containers that are accessible even from wheelchairs. "Some people experience joy just getting their hands in the dirt again," said Laura.



AST FACTS:

The courtyard includes benches, planting boxes, a water feature, as well as a number of different types of surfaces.

There are 24 patient rooms, which is an increase from 15 when this unit was located at the Center street site.

In addition to the courtyard, the new unit includes a therapy gym, dining room and activities of daily living (ADL) apartment where patients practice activities such as cooking and laundry.
