

Instructions for H. pylori Treatment

It has been determined that you are positive for H. pylori, a bacteria in your stomach that makes you prone to ulcers. This must be treated in a 3-step process:

STEP 1: Begin treatment for H. pylori.

- Prescriptions have been sent to your pharmacy. You will start a 2-week course of treatment. **Do not** miss any doses.
- The antibiotics ordered for you can upset your stomach. Increase probiotic intake by eating yogurt or drinking kefir (a yogurt like drink) daily while taking these.

STEP 2: After taking the <u>last dose</u> of the above prescriptions, you must wait four weeks before moving to step 3. You will remain off the following stomach medications during this time:

- Antibiotics, including specific therapy for H. pylori.
- Carafate (Sucralfate)
- Bismuth containing medications including:
 - Pepto Bismol
 - o Bismatrol
 - Pink Bismuth
 - o Devrom
 - o K-C
 - Kaodine (Kaopectate)
- **Proton Pump Inhibitors including:**
 - Prilosec (Omeprazole)
 - Prevacid (Lansoprazole)
 - Protonix (Pantoprazole)

NOTE: Malox, Mylanta, Rolaids, Alka Seltzer and Tums are OK

STEP 3: You must be re-tested to ensure the medications have been effective. After completing step 2, go to any Salem Health laboratory location to pick up supplies to submit a stool sample to re-test for H. pylori. You will collect the stool sample at home and return it to the Regional Lab location on State St.

Instructions for this test:

- You will need a sterile specimen container.
- Fresh stool is good for 2 hours at room temperature or 72 hours in the refrigerator.
